

**ESTABLISHMENT OF THE RED CROSS YOUTH COUNCILS AND TRAINING  
OF TEACHERS IN THE DIFFERENT RED CROSS SERVICES**

To: Undersecretaries

1. The Philippine National Red Cross (PNRC) is the foremost humanitarian organization in the country. Its mission is to bring timely, effective and compassionate humanitarian assistance to the most vulnerable without consideration of nationality, race, creed, gender, social status or political belief. One of its major services is the Red Cross Youth (RCY), which caters to children and youth aged 7 to 25 years old, by providing opportunities for directing and harnessing their energies and idealism into worthwhile humanitarian activities.

2. The RCY aims to :

- a. inculcate humanitarian values;
- b. instill the practice of healthy lifestyle;
- c. enhance youth leadership skills through service delivery; and
- d. advocate national/international friendship.

3. The major activities of the RCY are the following:

- a. conduct of youth developmental trainings which inculcate humanitarian principles and values of Red Cross, i.e. promotion of youth volunteerism, formation of effective humanitarian leaders and fostering positive group efforts and activities;
- b. promotion and practice of healthy lifestyle through HIV/AIDS and substance abuse prevention education, voluntary blood donation and road safety;
- c. active participation of the youth in the protection of life through first aid/basic life support trainings, disaster risk reduction efforts and junior first aiders' program, and community health activities;



- d. upholding the culture of excellence, peace, non-violence and non-discrimination among children and youth through the different RCY camps, RCY olympics, national/international exchange programs and gatherings and other friendship activities;
- e. RCY advisers' development and participation in harnessing the humanitarian skills and values of the children and youth through the council management trainings and formation of local and national RCY Advisers' League; and
- f. youth and volunteers' active involvement in Red Cross decision making process in the different levels of organization.


4. A Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) between the Philippine National Red Cross (PNRC) and the Department of Education (DepEd) was signed on February 14, 2008, when it was agreed that all public elementary and secondary schools must have an organized Red Cross Youth Council (RCYC) with at least one (1) adviser and forty three (43) youth members.

5. In this connection, all schools are encouraged to organize RCY Councils following their organization process and requirements and to appoint their teachers as RCYC Advisers who will undergo training under the PNRC.

6. These teachers are encouraged to be trained on the different Red Cross trainings such as First Aid, Basic Life Support (or Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation), and Disaster Management.

**RECOGNITION OF THE RED CROSS YOUTH AS OFFICIAL  
CO-CURRICULAR ORGANIZATION IN THE SCHOOLS**

To: **Regional Directors  
Schools Division/City Superintendents  
Heads, Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools**

1. The Red Cross Youth (RCY) is one of the six major services of the Philippine National Red Cross (PNRC). Its mission is to educate and empower the children and youth in the spirit of Red Cross through constructive trainings and effective leadership, and provide opportunities for directing and harnessing their energy and idealism into worthwhile humanitarian activities.
2. The major activities of the RCY are the following:
  - a. Advocacy and inculcation of moral values and character building;
  - b. Protection of life and promotion of community health;
  - c. Service and solidarity, which awaken in them the spirit of compassion to help people in dire need;
  - d. National and international friendship, understanding and education for peace; and
  - e. Dissemination of Red Cross Principles and International Humanitarian Law.
3. Pursuant thereto, the RCY is hereby recognized as one of the official co-curricular organizations in the schools, provided that RCY activities shall observe the time-on-task policy of the Department.
4. Accordingly, all concerned are encouraged to assist and support the establishment of the RCY Chapters in the schools. All elementary pupils and secondary students are encouraged to enlist as members of the Junior Red Cross (JRC) and the Senior Red Cross Youth (SRCY), respectively. Likewise, the school administrator shall designate a teacher to serve as adviser of the Red Cross Youth Council.
5. The Center for Students and Co-Curricular Affairs (CSCA), as the office in-charge of co-curricular matters, is tasked to coordinate and facilitate the activities of the Red Cross Youth in the Department of Education.
6. 
**DEPED-PNRC RED CROSS 143 PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM**

1. In support to the Memorandum of Agreement signed between the Department of Education (DepED) and the Philippine National Red Cross (PNRC) dated February 14, 2008, the PNRC hosted regional meetings with DepED local officials to introduce Red Cross 143 Program as a partnership activity between these two (2) agencies which aims to educate the communities with humanitarian actions, principles and values.
2. Red Cross 143 is a program conceptualized by the Philippine National Red Cross that teaches people to look after and care for their respective communities. It ensures every community in the country to be prepared and responsive in case of emergency. This Office seeks for the support and participation of all concerned to this undertaking.
3. This program aims to create a minimum of 44 volunteers in every barangay, 1 Team Leader and 43 members, which shall be trained in: a) disaster preparedness and response; b) health and welfare; and c) voluntary blood donation and advocacy.
4. The partnership concept is to appoint every Barangay Elementary School Principal as the Community Team Leader who will create the Red Cross 143 Team in their respective barangay, composed of teachers, PTCA officers and community leaders.
5. Red Cross 143 Program envisions a network of volunteers in every community nationwide that would provide essential information and be mobilized in the field in times of emergencies or disasters. This program upholds and encourages the spirit of volunteerism in the community, thereby delivering timely, effective and compassionate humanitarian assistance.



**GRANT OF SERVICE CREDITS TO TEACHER-ADVISERS  
OF RED CROSS YOUTH COUNCILS (RCYC)**

To: Undersecretaries

All Others Concerned

1. The Department of Education (DepEd) recognizes the Red Cross Youth (RCY) as one of the official co-curricular organizations in the schools as stipulated in DepEd Order No. 38, s. 2005 entitled *Recognition of the Red Cross Youth as Official Co-Curricular Organization in the Schools*. One of the major services of the Philippine National Red Cross (PNRC) is its mission to educate and empower the children and youth in the spirit of Red Cross, through constructive meetings and effective leadership, and provide opportunities for directing and harnessing their energy and idealism into worth humanitarian activities.
2. In this connection, DepEd encourages the organization of the RCYC in all public elementary and secondary schools with at least one teacher-adviser and 43 youth members as provided in DepEd Memorandum No. 102, s. 2011 entitled *Establishment of the Red Cross Youth Council and Training of Teachers in the Different Red Cross Services*. The teacher-advisers are expected to participate in the different Red Cross trainings such as First Aid, Basic Life Support (or Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and Disaster Management.
3. Recognizing the efforts and support of the teacher-advisers of the RCYC, they are hereby granted service credits of not more than ten days, exclusive of the allowable 15 days for every year pursuant to DepEd Order No. 53, s. 2003 entitled *Updated Guidelines on Grant of Vacation Service Credits to Teachers* for their participation in RCYC activities provided that the activity is recognized and authorized by the schools division superintendents (SDSs).
4. The school heads shall submit to the SDS the request for the grant of service credits clearly indicating the RCYC activity participated in by the teacher-adviser. The discretion to determine the number of service credits that may be allowed for participation in the RCYC activity is vested with the SDS.
5. Immediate dissemination of and strict compliance with this Order is directed.

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

### KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS

This Memorandum of Agreement is made and entered into by and among:

**THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION (DepEd)**, a line agency of the Philippine Government that is mandated to protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality basic education and take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all, with office address at DepEd Complex, Meralco Avenue, Pasig City represented herein by its Secretary, **Secretary LEONOR MAGTOLIS BRIONES**, hereinafter referred to as the "DepEd".

**THE PHILIPPINE RED CROSS (PRC)**, an independent, autonomous, non-governmental organization auxiliary to the government of the Republic of the Philippines duly created and organized by virtue of Republic Act No.95, otherwise known as "An Act to Incorporate the Philippine National Red Cross" as amended and recognized by Republic Act no. 10072, otherwise known as the "Philippine Red Cross Act of 2009" with address at 37 EDSA corner Boni Avenue, Mandaluyong, represented herein by its Chairman and CEO, **Senator RICHARD JUICO GORDON**, hereinafter referred to as the "PRC".

### RECITALS:

**WHEREAS**, under Republic Act No. 9155, otherwise known as "Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001, the Department of Education shall establish, maintain, and support a complete, adequate and integrated system of basic education relevant to the needs of the people and society. It shall establish and maintain a system of free and compulsory public education in the elementary level and free public education in the high school level.

A handwritten signature in blue ink, appearing to be the initials "LMB" followed by a flourish.

**WHEREAS**, section 3 of Republic Act 10871, otherwise known as " An act requiring basic education students to undergo age-appropriate basic life support training", affirms that it shall be the duty of all public and private basic education schools operating nationwide to provide their students with basic life support training through the use of psychomotor training in an age-appropriate manner. The section further proceeds that instruction shall include programs which have been developed by the Philippine Red Cross using nationally-recognized, evidence-based guidelines for emergency cardiovascular care, and psychomotor training, to support the instruction. As far as practicable, basic education schools shall incorporate basic life support training as part of the schools' comprehensive health and physical education curriculum.

**WHEREAS**, the Philippines as member state of Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) has committed itself to make children more resilient to disasters by making schools safe and secure through the ASEAN Safe Schools Initiative (ASSI).

**WHEREAS**, the PRC is a leading provider of first aid and basic life support courses in country along with a full range of capacity for pre-hospital emergency medical services complemented by a state of the art emergency operation center.

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to train all Filipino citizen, especially young people to be ready in times of unlikely event that may happen in the future. Such that Red Cross Youth and Red Cross 143 volunteers must be first to know, first to assess and first to respond;

**WHEREAS**, the parties entered into a Memorandum of Understanding declaring their mutual intention to cooperate and collaborate for the promotion of volunteerism, humanitarian values, health and safety, community resilience, and the international humanitarian law.

**NOW THEREFORE**, for and in consideration of the above premises, the Parties do hereby jointly agree and bind themselves to undertake the following:




**I. UNDERTAKINGS OF DEPED:**

1. Encourage children's participation in PRC's Junior first Aiders program where they are trained on basic first and basic life support- CPR
2. Conduct regular preparedness and emergency response drills which support the practice of first aid and other lifesaving skills by students and teachers;
3. Allow trained Red Cross Youth first aiders to be assigned as Junior First Aiders in the school and be stationed in the school clinic
4. Encourage the voluntary participation of students under the supervision of their teachers in Red Cross Youth first aid competitions
5. Have at least two (2) Red Cross Youth Teacher-Advisers trained as First Aid and Basic Life Support trainers who will be certified by the Philippine Red Cross as co-facilitators for the administration of such training in schools.
6. Promote the free use of PRC Mobile First Aid Application

**II. UNDERTAKINGS OF THE PRC:**

1. Train children on first aid and basic life support- CPR through its junior first aiders program at minimum fee of Php 300.00 per participant, their teachers at Php 350.00 per participant.
2. Provide technical support for DepEd's regular preparedness and emergency response drills which support the practice of first aid and other lifesaving skills by students and teachers;
3. Train Red Cross Youth first aiders and monitor their engagement as Junior First Aiders in the school who are also stationed in the school clinic
4. Promote and organize the voluntary participation of students under the supervision of their teacher in Red Cross Youth first aid competitions
5. Train least two (2) Red Cross Youth Teacher-Advisers as First Aid and Basic Life Support- CPR trainers who will be certified by the Philippine Red Cross as co-facilitators for the administration of such training in schools.
6. Provide orientations on the free use of PRC Mobile First Aid Application



**III. EFFECTIVITY AND TERMINATION:**

This agreement shall take effect immediately upon signing hereof and shall remain in force until any party expresses in writing its desire to terminate the agreement; provided, however, that such termination shall take effect one (1) month from the written receipt by the other party.




