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

1. In reference to DM-OUOPS-2025-11-01288, the Learner Rights and Protection Division (LRPD), in collaboration with the Curriculum and Teaching Strand and Stairway Foundation, Inc. proposes the conduct of a classroom-based learning session to increase awareness against OSAEC and CSAEM through integration on appropriate subject areas its core messages at the elementary and secondary levels.

The SDO Level Form shall be submitted to the Regional Office on or before April 11,2025.



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

In line thereto, the LRPD in collaboration with the Curriculum and Teaching Strand and in partnership with the Stairway Foundation Inc. proposes the conduct of a classroom-based learning session to increase awareness against OSAEC and CSAEM through integration in appropriate subject areas its core messages at the elementary and secondary levels.
